

The Gambia has a structured basic education system, but families must bear some of the costs. This limits the opportunities available to less well-off children and around 40% do not attend school, because their parents are too poor to afford the modest fees, uniforms and books. PAGEANT, standing for 'Projects Aiding Gambian Education And Natural Talent', is a small UK registered charity (No. 1093963). We help individual students with sponsorship, help schools with improvements to buildings, facilities and equipment, and help poor families to improve their quality of life.

Sponsor a Child's Education



Many Gambian children from poor families can't afford to attend school. Many who start drop out after Grade 6 or 9. when costs increase. Sponsorship of an individual child is one way of addressing this problem. It can be very fulfilling for the sponsor as well as for the child, as progress through school is monitored and reports, with letters or drawings from the child, are sent regularly to the sponsor. We also ask the sponsor to send a letter and photograph to 'their' child to provide a sense of personal involvement. Experience has shown that the children really appreciate this. Pageant also has an Emergency Fund for children who have progressed some way in school but whose parents cannot now afford school or exam fees. If you would like to be involved, but can't make a commitment to one child for a number of years, then you might like to contribute to this fund. A single donation of £15 can make the difference between a child's exclusion from school and being able to take an important exam.

Pageant Projects



As well as helping individual students with sponsorship, Pageant helps schools with new buildings such as toilets, kitchens and classrooms, and with furniture and equipment.



Many schools have their own vegetable gardens, both for teaching purposes, and to provide supplies for school meals. Pageant has helped by providing plants, and building secure enclosures to keep out marauding animals.



Most schools in The Gambia lack science teaching equipment and many have no mains electricity. This presents a challenge to science teachers and science is taught mainly as a theoretical subject. Pageant has supplied many schools with suitable equipment and runs regular seminars for science teachers.







Malaria is endemic in The Gambia, and recurring illness often prevents children attending school. Pageant helps by providing mosquito nets to poor families. We also encourage village communities to plant Artemisia annua, from which they can make a tea which combats the effects of malaria.

Pageant operates a micro-loan scheme, which encourages groups of village women to start their own small businesses. When repaid after six months, the loans get recycled to another group. One of our schemes resulted in a new village market at Sika.
