


Search results and Page Rank

Google is the acknowledged leader amongst search engines, so we don't now check other search engines. In searches using 'gambia' 'education' and 'charity', our home page has maintained a high placing. It is currently at No. 5. The Google PageRank* of our home page has remained at 4 for about five years. (* a rating system used by Google to show how important they think a page is. The minimum is 0 and maximum 10, with a logarithmic scale.)

Traffic to the Website



The graph above shows that there is a lot of month-to-month variation in traffic to our website. The graph of annual totals below shows an underlying downward trend from a peak in 2008. This is possibly a mirror of economic conditions in the UK, with fewer people having spare cash for charities, and therefore less interest in charity websites. However, we are confident that our core support remains firm, even though reduced casual viewing of our website may reflect the continuing difficult economic times.

Top 20 Pages Viewed

The following is a list of the top 20 pages viewed during 2012compared with the number of views during 2011. There are winners and losers. Obviously older pages lose relevance and are looked at less. However, there are some surprises. Sarah Hayes' page is still attracting significant views, and even more surprising, the Ice Cold page from the 2007 Banjul Challenge is increasing its views. We are slightly troubled by decreased views of 'main' pages such as 'news', 'projects', 'contact', 'information' and 'sponsorship', but other 'main' pages have maintained or increased their views. It is significant that 17 of these top pages were in the top 20 last year, so really, not much has changed.
